Baking Before Repairs



The ovens were actively used before earthquake and were in need of serious repairs and refurbishment. The photo on the right shows the bread ready for distribution. The bakery is functioning far beyond its original capacity, providing families not only with food, but also with a source of income.

Old/New Roof



The photo on the left shows the old roof compared to the photo on the right which shows the final improvements and completed repairs. It is so much brighter in the bakery now with the new roof and the cheerful yellow paint.

Bread Distribution



The bakery has provided 300 women with jobs. They buy bread at a wholesale cost in the morning and sell individual loaves on the street during the day. The bakery is functioning far beyond its original capacity, providing families not only with food, but also with a source of income. On the right a woman pictured with Fr.
